Great progress has been made so far, thanks to the support and participation of the local community. We are currently finalising a program of events for the autumn. Initiatives that are underway include, for example; a co-ordinated program of Irish language classes, the Diploma sa Ghaeilge in collaboration with the University of Galway, Irish language supports for Gaeltacht scheme schools and young people in our Gaeltacht area, including Maratón na bPáistí and Club UISCE.
